1. Illustrations should be collected and made available so that potential participants can gain a sense of what's ahead — both the (messy) process and the rewarding outcomes — before they commit the time, attention, and good will to a heterogeneous collaboration.
2. Illustrations should be collected and made available of people who made the shift from individual, expertise-based work to heterogeneous collaboration and can speak to the mistakes that were made under the former and the gratification and previously un/des articulated aspirations met through the latter.
3. People can develop some of the skills and dispositions to be effective participants through participation, but how much advance training for participation is advisable and how to make this happen?
4. If fear helps ~~not~~ keep us as bystanders and being a bystander engenders fear in us (because we see that we could be "by-stood" too), then should we bring ~~that~~ fear front and center in our attempts at heterogeneous collaboration.
5. How to produce mutual understanding across ages, building on age-appropriate reflection?
